

Deadline fast approaching...January 31st 2018 For this performance of the 1890's classic!



Star of India... Overnight!

Prelude to the Revolution 1774

Set sail on the eve of the American Revolution! Re-live the turbulent year of 1774 experiencing the struggle of merchant mariners sailing the triangle trade route between New England and the Caribbean. Embarking on a voyage of the imagination, students will role-play with our maritime instructors, raising sails, loading cargo and protecting the vessel from pirates. Navigating their way through the political storms of the era, students will face frustrations that inspired American colonists to revolt. Ultimately, they will choose their own destiny and find out what role they will play in the war for America's freedom.

The Blue Moon – second of two full moons in one calendar month – will pass through the Earth's shadow on January 31, 2018, to give us a total lunar eclipse. *Totality*, when the moon will be entirely inside the Earth's dark umbral shadow, will last a bit more than one-and-a-quarter hours. The January 31 full moon is also the third in a series of three straight full moon <u>supermoons</u> – that is, super-close full moons. It's the first of two Blue Moons in 2018. So it's not just a lunar eclipse, or a Blue Moon, or a supermoon. It's all three ... a super Blue Moon eclipse! It is the first Blue Moon total eclipse in 150 years in the Americas!

CALIFORNIA WOLF CENTER

Join us for an exciting visit to the California Wolf Center where the preservation and protection of wolves is their passion. This fieldtrip includes presentation on the history of the wolves in North America and how they are working to recover the species today, followed by a guided observation of their two ambassador packs; The Mexican gray wolf and the North American gray wolf. All of their animals are kept as wild as possible, so during our visit we will observe the wolves from behind a fence line. What the wolves choose to do during our visit is entirely up to them!



WHEN: Tuesday, February 20, 2018 @ 1:30 PM

WHERE: California Wolf Center in Julian

We will be meeting at the start of the Center's access road, where K Q Ranch Road intersects with Highway 79. From there, we will line up our vehicles in a caravan and drive together the rest of the way, about 3/4 of a mile. It is a dirt road so it's a bumpy ride, but you won't need 4-wheel drive. COST: \$10.75 per person (children 4 and under free)



- Reservations are required. Due to limited seating, you may not be admitted if you arrive without a reservation.
- ✓ Pets are not allowed at the California Wolf Center. Pets may not be left in vehicles.
- ✓ Parental guidance is required for all guests under the age of 18.
- ✓ Please arrive at the specified check in time.

- As a courtesy to others, late arrivals will not be admitted.
- Please wait for an escort when you reach the dirt road.
- For your safety and for the safety of the animals on exhibit, all tours are guided.
- You must remain with your escort and/or guide at all times.
- Cameras and binoculars are welcome.
 Photographs may be taken through the enclosure fences.
- The California Wolf Center experiences extreme temperatures and weather conditions. Dress in layers, as the weather can be unpredictable. Wear comfortable closed-toed walking shoes and bring sun protection.
- ✓ Call 760-765-0030 to check weather and road conditions before your visit.
- ✓ The California Wolf Center is located down 3/4 of a mile of rugged dirt road. Please drive slowly on this road (10 miles per hour or less). Large vehicles and motorcycles are not permitted on this road.
- ✓ It is sometimes necessary to cancel programs due to weather.

DIRECTIONS: From 8 East

Take I-8 East.

Take exit 40 toward CA-79/Japatul Valley Rd (Highway 79). Turn left at CA-79 N (Highway 79 North).

Approximately 2.5 miles north of I-8, turn left to stay on CA-79 (follow green signs to stay on Highway 79 North).

Pass Lake Cuyamaca. Pass Sunrise Highway(S-1).

Approximately 1.5 miles after Sunrise Highway (S-1), turn right at K Q Ranch Rd.

Go approximately 0.25 miles on K Q Ranch Road. Turn right onto the dirt road (Kenis/ Christiansen Private Road). Wait at the California Wolf Center sign for an escort.

From Points North

Take CA-78 toward Julian.
Follow all signs to stay on CA-78.
In the town of Julian, turn right on Main St.
Turn right onto CA-79 S (Highway 79 South, between the gas station and the post office).
Head south for approximately 4 miles.

Turn left onto K Q Ranch Road.

Go approximately 0.25 miles on K Q Ranch Road. Turn right onto the dirt road (Kenis/ Christiansen Private Road). Wait at the California Wolf Center sign for an escort.
