The Comparison Trap

Are there any Lone Ranger Homeschool Moms out there? Is that you? Just because you're in one of our CFS groups, doesn't mean you're in fellowship with other moms. Perhaps you are slugging it out on your own because you're new and you don't know any other homeschool families very well. Do you live in a remote area? Or maybe you're not new but you have other extenuating circumstances which keep you from interacting with other families. I felt alone during my first year of homeschooling. I had a 2 year old and a 6 month old when I began homeschooling. My older two were in 3rd grade and Kindergarten. It was a hard year as I bumbled along on my own, having limited interaction with other moms. Was I doing enough? Was I doing too much? How could I know?

Thankfully I didn't quit, and the following year I was able to develop friendships with other homeschool moms. That created another danger—the comparison trap. I began hearing about the fabulous and elaborate lesson plans that some were creating for their kids. I found out some taught their kids Latin and that others used board games to teach math. Some didn't include every subject throughout the year, others had kids who were several grades ahead. Subconsciously I found myself comparing myself with each homeschool mom I met. I soon found that constantly comparing can be brutal and destructive!

One year at a homeschool convention, a wise speaker discussed our propensity to compare ourselves with other homeschool moms. Unfortunately we also compare our marriages, our kids, our possessions etc.... It can put us in a downward spiral. Instead of comparing, we need to find God's plan for us and to walk in it. It's fine to find out what others are doing, to learn from their mistakes, and to take recommendations for curriculum etc. There's no need to reinvent the wheel. But don't beat yourself up if you aren't able to do everything like your friend Susie Homeschooler.

How do you know what is right for your family? Pray and seek guidance from God. His yoke is easy and His burden is light according to Matthew 11:30. This means that if you set yourself up with an impossible schedule that is leaves you so stressed out that you are ready to quit, then it needs to be adjusted. Sit down with your spouse and get their input. Perhaps you can save a subject for the summer and solve some time issues. There are many ways to make small changes that can make a very real difference to your sanity.

I pray for health and strength to all of our CFS members! I pray for endurance as you complete the second half of your school year. I pray courage for you as you do the hard job of discipling your children. It's not easy but the rewards are great.

The San Diego High Tech Fair is a unique experience for students from 6th though 12th grades to visit with representatives of local high tech companies. They will learn from interactive experiences how the world of science can be fun and rewarding. The students enjoy seeing "real life" applications of what they already may be learning and includes over 60 exhibitors from local, cutting-edge STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) organizations. You will find demonstrations in Physics, Bio-Tech, Chemistry, Engineering, Nano-technology, Robotics and much more! This is a wonderful venue for a cooperative effort between business and education.

Participating companies include interactive activities that clearly explain their companies' technologies and products. Because the entrance of each group is staggered by 30 minutes, each student can visit each booth easily and not miss any of the exciting exhibits. This is not a career fair, it's a technology fair, and it's loads of fun!

General Atomics Fusion Education Tour

General Atomics (GA) has been an international leader in magnetic fusion research since the 1960s. The DIII-D National Fusion Facility, operated by GA for the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE), is the largest magnetic fusion research facility operating in the U.S. Magnetic fusion research at GA has led to vital scientific discoveries as well as spinoff technologies that have advanced the state of the art in medical diagnostics, transportation, semiconductors, electronics, and defense applications, including the <u>Electromagnetic Aircraft Launch System (EMALS)</u> being deployed on the next generation of U.S. Navy aircraft carriers.

The DIII-D Facility Tour is a General Atomics Fusion Education field trip suitable for grades 5-12 and encompasses both advanced technology and fundamental scientific principles. Under the guidance of scientists and engineers, students explore multiple hands-on demonstration stations covering topics in design and engineering, data acquisition, fusion production, and plasma control.

Some of the topics covered will include:

- Plasma the 4th state of matter and the first step to fusion
- Radiation, radioactivity, and risk assessment
- Data acquisition and analysis
- The electromagnetic spectrum
- The DIII-D tokamak & control room
- Computer aided design/engineering
- Discussions of energy use, environmental impact, college preparation for scientific careers





CFS teens have been attending Worldview Academy's Leadership Camps for many years, resulting in many great reports from both parents and students! Here is the information for this summer's camp in Southern California.

Worldview Academy Leadership Camps are intense week-long camps designed to teach

Christian students to think and live in accord with a biblical worldview. Camps are for students ages 13 and up. Students are trained in Worldviews, Servant Leadership, Apologetics & Evangelism. These three concentrations come together and form a solid foundation upon which students build a consistent, biblical worldview. Students are prepared to defend themselves against the culture's attacks and, at the

same time, are equipped to lead the charge to win the culture back for Christ. Students are treated like real people and prepared to deal with the tough issues they face in the real world. They also **meet great people and make lasting friendships**.

The dates for this year's camp in Southern California are **June 23rd-28th**, and it will be at The Master's College in Santa Clarita. The regular rate per person is \$745. Check for the sibling rate if you are sending more than one student. Session fee covers camp program, room and board, camp t-shirt, and the Worldview Student Notebook.

Susan K. Beatty Scholarship

Each year CHEA awards a \$1000 scholarship to a graduating home-educated student who is going to a college, university, or accredited career or vocational school in the fall following high school graduation. Each Support Network Group may nominate two students for the Susan K. Beatty Scholarship. If you believe your student is eligible, ask your group leader to consider a scholarship nomination. They will supply you with an application. Applications must be submitted to CHEA no later than February 28 each year. For more information, contact sndirector@cheaofca.org.

To be eligible for the scholarship, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Applicants must have been privately homeschooled (not enrolled in a public school program), with their parents teaching them at home at least 51% of the time and at least 51% of the academic subjects, for at least the last four years.
- 2. Applicants must be at least 17 by December 1 of the previous year and no older than 19 on June 30 the spring the award is granted.
- 3. Applicant's parents must have been CHEA Members at least two years prior to the scholarship award, with their Membership maintained through July of the scholarship award year.
- 4. Applicants must have been members in good standing in one or more Support Network Member Groups for at least two years prior to submitting their application.
- 5. Applicants must be accepted for admission to a college (including community college), university, or accredited career/vocational school in September of the award year.

Applicants must be able to attend the Saturday morning General Session of the Annual Convention, if selected to receive the scholar-ship.

Tour a working horse ranch. Hear how the rescue horses touch the lives of service members, first responders, and their families. Learn to groom a horse. Watch horse training in action. Learn about the heard and the special hierarchy that arises in the heard.

Meet: Boo and Dylan, a Clydesdale and a draft horse. Thoroughbred: King, The Girls: Barbie, Stormie, Breenie, Splash, The Old Timer: Bonita (33 years old) The Stud: Tequila, The Heard: Cole, Romie, Cap,

Storm Son's Ranch Equine Therapy and Horse Rescue has 13 rescue horses, all with varying stories of pain and heart break. These special horses need special care. This is where veterans and their families come in. Tammy, at Saddles in Service, pairs the service member with a horse and teaches the veteran how to groom and care for that horse while building a special bond. The service member then takes the horse into a round pen to learn how to train a horse and eventually ride him. This is a one of a kind program that allows for both participants, veteran and horse, to heal from their past and pains. When at the ranch, all worries fade away. There is healing around the gentle spirits of the horses.

Saddles in Service does all this for free. As a start up, this program is struggling to maintain offering this program. We would love to be able to offer them a love offering the day of the field trip as a way to say thank you for the time they've taken to share their ranch with us. If able, we are asking that each family that attends brings \$20 per family (collected by Tiffani Crews).
